IASWG Committee and Chapter Activity: The June IASWG Board meeting was engaging and energizing. We had full representation from our many IASWG Chapter Representatives and IASWG Committee Chair/Co-Chairs, and the result was an active and productive meeting. Committee Chairs/Co-chairs presented and discussed all of the noteworthy accomplishments and progress currently happening in their Committee areas, and they outlined ways in which the Committees would continue to contribute to IASWG in the future. Each of our 17 chapters had a representative at the Board meeting: Tennessee, South Africa, Germany, North Carolina, Northeast Ohio, European, Lithuania, Southern California, Central Florida, Toronto, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Florida, Long Island, Francophone Chapter, Illinois, NYC, and Pennsylvania. In addition, IASWG Chapter folks have been conducting chapter events the past few months, and are actively planning future activities. Lastly, the Executive Committee of the IASWG Board phone conferenced recently to discuss current IASWG issues; our most recent IASWG Treasurer Reports submitted by our IASWG Treasurer, Dominique Steinberg, have shown that we continue to move forward with financial prudence and with financial health.
